Declaration of Interests in Items on the Agenda:

Mr P Hammett declared an interest in planning applications PA15/01276 – New Trevibban Farm and PA14/08635 – Wind Farm at Scotland Corner. Mrs Sue Sleep and Mr D Heard also declared their interest in PA14/08635.

Police Report:

For the Period 10/02/15-10/03/15 for St Issey Parish. Between the above dates there were 3 reported logged incidents and 2 crimes, one of these refers to a crime at the school over half term – a tent was removed from the school and later found damaged in the adjacent field, together with some litter and a sleeping bag.

The payment for the Neighbourhood watch signs has been received but Clive's colleague has been off sick with a broken ankle so there has been a delay in processing the request.

Matters Arising:

- 1. The defibrillator training evening had been very well attended so another one has been arranged for 15th April at 7.30pm in the Ring o'Bells.
- 2. The overhanging bushes outside the school will be sorted by the St Issey in Bloom Group.
- 3. The WW1 commemoration service was held on 1st March. The Parish Council thanked Mr J Carhart for cleaning the war memorial. Although the poppies hadn't arrived, each group was given a lovely handmade card in commemoration at the service, and once they have arrived and been put together the poppies will be placed inside the church.
- 4. Superfast broadband is generally available now in most areas in St Issey although some areas are still not receiving a good service.
- 5. The BT manhole cover has not yet been fixed. Clerk to chase.
- 6. Wind Turbines at Trevibban clerk to check planning application should there be one or two turbines?
